Our Leadership & Public Service Concentration gives students the opportunity to develop skills to be successful in careers dedicated to serving others while gaining knowledge and experience in social justice, in impacting community, and in profoundly contributing to our diverse world.

Student Experience

Our hybrid model provides students the experience of learning in a classroom and the personalization provided

by online learning. Students will take the Concentration's Course of Study in a classroom setting while taking the other courses using an online platform – all with the support of the site-based teachers. Activities emphasize a focus on leadership, teamwork, communication and organization. Students will participate in Model UN, community services events, mentorships, and internships.

Learning Center (at the Site-Based location)

Open from 1pm–3pm Monday–Thursday. A place and time for students to practice, enrich, reteach, and enhance their learning with the support of teachers. The Center is a place to collaborate with peers, to participate in clubs, to innovate in our Makerspace.
